**LESSON TITLE:** Figurative Language

**GRADE:** Five

**OBJECTIVE:** Students use KidPix to illustrate figurative language.

**CURRICULUM CONNECTION:** Language Arts

**MATERIALS:** KidPix, computer, printer, SmartBoard to demonstrate

**PROCEDURE:** (Read to students)

Today we're going to use KidPix to write and illustrate figurative language.

1. Find KidPix on your dock.
2. Click on it one time.
3. Click your mouse once to get past the start up screen.
4. Click on Student and select Go.
5. Select the Text Tool. Click one time in the top left corner of your document. Type your name.
6. Now decide on the type of figurative language you'd like to illustrate. Hit the return key one time and type a sentence illustrating it.
7. Now use the drawing tools (and stamps/stickers) to illustrate your sentence or phrase.
8. Export slides in .jpg format.

Teacher then assembles into one class slideshow. Show on SmartBoard and have students guess what type of figurative language is being illustrated.

**EVALUATION:** Sample rubric below, or teacher created rubric. Assign your own values if desired.
