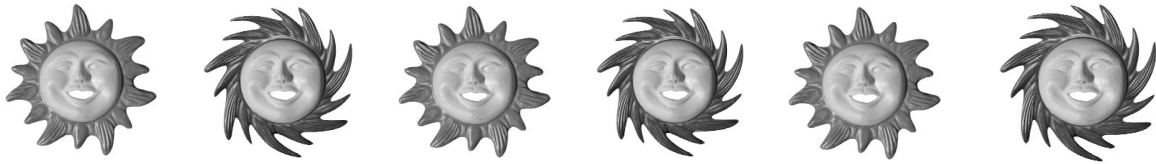

PROGRAMS AT PLAINVILLE HIGH SCHOOL

The Plainville Summer School will offer a variety of courses to secondary school students. Successful completion of the course(s) will provide the student with a grade and credit toward graduation.

ENROLLMENT

Courses are open to all Plainville students, residents and non-residents. Eligibility for enrollment in specific courses offered is listed under REQUIREMENTS. Adults may also enroll in courses.

REGISTRATION DATES

May 30, 2004-June 30, 2004

Students going on vacation during the Summer School Session should not register for classes if they are not going to be present the required number of days.

REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

In-person registration will be held in Room 115 at Plainville High School between 9:00 AM and 3:00 PM, May 30, 2004-June 30, 2004. Payment must accompany registration forms. Cash, bank checks, or money orders made out to Plainville Summer School will be accepted. Students paying in cash must bring in the exact amount due.

Mail-in registration will be accepted beginning

immediately. You are requested to register for course selections as soon as possible to allow the school district sufficient time to set up class rosters. Please note the schedule of classes depending on grade level or program.

PAYMENTS AND REFUNDS

The Plainville Summer School is a self-sustaining program sponsored by the Plainville Community Schools. Tuition payment must accompany the registration form. Students will not be registered without payment. Full refund will be given for all withdrawals prior to the first class session. Classes will be canceled if the minimum enrollment is not attained.

All activities offered by Plainville Adult Education are held in accessible locations. Accommodations for individuals with a disability are available upon request.

REQUIREMENTS FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE HIGH SCHOOL SUMMER SCHOOL PROGRAM

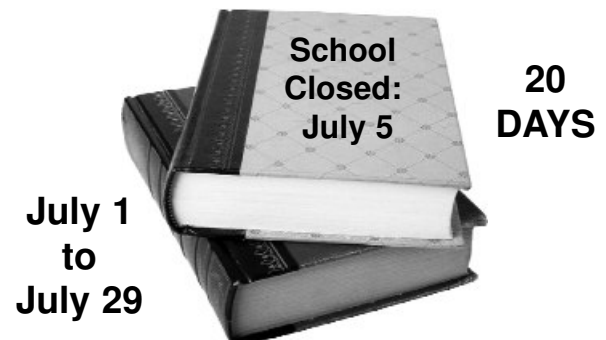
1. Students shall be permitted a maximum of 1 absence. Three tardies are equivalent to one absence. If a student is more than 5 minutes late to class, a tardy will be recorded by the instructor. If he/she is 15 minutes late, an absence will be recorded by said instructor. Absences beyond those listed can only be excused by the building principal or his/her designee.
2. A final exam must be taken at the conclusion of all summer school courses and will account for 20% of the final grade.
3. Each summer class shall be 1.5 hours in length for a semester course. Each summer class shall be three hours in length for a full year course.
4. Twenty class sessions are required for a semester course. Twenty class sessions are required for a full year course.
5. Students who have lost credit because of the attendance policy may attend summer school provided they:

- have remained in the course for the entire semester/year;
- have completed the assigned work;
- have not exceeded 15 absences in a semester course, 30 absences in a full year.

6. If the summer course(s) is taken to make up a failing grade, students must have been enrolled for the entire course and have achieved a minimum grade of 40 during the regular school year to be eligible.
7. Credit for summer school courses will be awarded only to the amount lost in any individual school year or, as extended by permission of the building principal or his/her designee.
8. Students are to be scheduled sequentially in courses, as appropriate.
9. Summer school grades will be recorded on a student's transcript according to the established grading policy of the high school.

STUDENTS AND PARENTS SHOULD CAREFULLY REVIEW THE NEW TIME SCHEDULE FOR SUMMER CLASSES.

REGULATIONS

- Students are not to loiter around the building prior to or after attending class.
- Students creating any discipline problems in class will be asked to leave the class; there will be no return of fees.
